III..JEFFERSON BARRACKS NATIONAL CEMETERY, MISSOURI.—The following-described tract of land, now a part of the Jefferson Barracks Military Reservation, Missouri, is hereby made a part of the Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery, Missouri, and placed under the jurisdiction of The Quartermaster General:

A tract of land situated in Section 36, Township 44 N., Range 6 E.; Section 1, Township 43 N., Range 6 E.; Section 6, Township 43 N., Range 7 E.; and U. S. Survey 3341, Township 44 N., Range 7 E., Saint Louis County, Missouri, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the west boundary of Jefferson Barracks Military Reservation, which bears N. 54°24' W., 1001.1 feet, and N. 0°09' E., 1135.7 feet from a stone marking the intersection of the north line of U. S. Survey 3119 and the north line of Corondelet Commons, and running thence along the west boundary of Jefferson Barracks Military Reservation the following bearings and distances:

N. 0°09' E., 1210.1 feet; N. 35°40' E., 861.0 feet; thence easterly across the Jefferson Barracks Military Reservation the following bearings and distances: S. 87°29'43'' E., 2322.17 feet; S. 86°55'13'' E., 895.24 feet; S. 88°18'39'' E., 1126.86 feet, to the northwest corner of the existing National Cemetery; thence the following bearings and distances along a line common to the west boundary of the existing National Cemetery: S. 34°39' W., 135.2 feet; S. 27°53'30'' W., 545.7 feet; S. 0°21'30'' W., 734.7 feet, to the southwest corner of the existing National Cemetery; thence the following bearing and distance along a line common to the north boundary of the existing Veterans Administration area: N. 89°36'30'' W., 135.1 feet; thence the following bearings and distances along a line common to the north boundary of that area of the Jefferson Barracks Military Reservation previously transferred to the Veterans Administration: N. 0°23'30'' W., 10.0 feet; N. 86°32' W., 465.0 feet; N. 2°39'30'' E., 82.0 feet; N. 86°58' W., 552.0 feet; S. 4°36'30'' W., 100.0 feet; N. 85°22' W., 186.0 feet; S. 44°57'30'' W., 72.0 feet;

N. $42^{\circ}29'30''$ W., 95.0 feet; S. $54^{\circ}39'30''$ W., 95.0 feet; N. $86^{\circ}06'$ W., 233.8 feet;
S. $83^{\circ}56'$ W., 2736.7 feet to the point of beginning.

The tract described contains 160.86 acres, more or less.

All ranges referred to are east of the fifth principal meridian.
