**I..CAMP IRWIN, CALIFORNIA.**—Effective as of 16 October 1948, Camp Irwin, California, was established as a class I subinstallation of Fort MacArthur, California, Harbor Defense of Los Angeles, California, under the control of the Commanding General, Sixth Army.
