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I. FORT TOTTEN, NEW YORK.—Effective 30 June 1949, the Fort Totten Army Medical Center, Fort Totten, New York, including the Fort Totten General Hospital, will be discontinued.

II. SAN ANTONIO GENERAL DEPOT, U. S. ARMY, SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS.—Effective 30 June 1949, the Medical Section of San Antonio General Depot, U. S. Army, San Antonio, Texas, will be discontinued.

III. TILTON GENERAL HOSPITAL, FORT DIX, NEW JERSEY.—Effective 30 June 1949, Tilton General Hospital, Fort Dix, New Jersey, will be discontinued. The hospital facilities will revert to the Fort Dix station hospital.
