I..AMERICAN GRAVES REGISTRATION SERVICE.—Effective as of 0001, 1 July 1950, paragraph 4c, section I, DA General Orders 10, 1950, will be rescinded and the Mediterranean Zone (short title: AGRS-MZ) will be discontinued. Responsibility for American Graves Registration Service residual functions and activities in this zone becomes that of the Commanding General, United States Army, Europe.

II..ARMY ANTI-AIRCRAFT COMMAND.—Effective 1 July 1950, the Army Antiaircraft Command will be established with headquarters at the Pentagon, Washington 25, D. C. The Commanding General, Army Antiaircraft Command, will report to the Chief of Staff, United States Army, for all matters pertaining to this Command.

III..ARMY LANGUAGE SCHOOL.—Effective 1 July 1950, the Army Language School, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Department of the Army, located at the Presidio of Monterey, California, will be redesignated as a class I activity under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, Sixth Army.

IV..ARMY REGIONAL ACCOUNTS OFFICE, FORT McPHERSON, GEORGIA.—Effective 1 July 1950, an Army Regional Accounts Office will be established at Fort McPherson, Georgia, as a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Finance, Department of the Army.

V..CHEMICAL SUPPLY SECTIONS.—1. Effective 30 June 1950, the Chemical Supply Section of Columbus General Depot, U. S. Army, Ohio, will be discontinued.

2. Effective 30 June 1950, the Chemical Supply Section of Schenectady General Depot, U. S. Army, New York, will be discontinued.

VI..DUGWAY PROVING GROUND, TOOELE, UTAH.—Effective 1 July 1950, the Dugway Proving Ground, Tooele, Utah, a class II industrial installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief, Chemical Corps, will be placed in an active status.

2. *Effective 30 June 1950*, the Deseret Chemical Depot, Utah, a class II activity of Western Chemical Center, Utah, will be redesignated a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief, Chemical Corps.

3. *Effective 30 June 1950*, the Western Chemical Center, Utah, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief, Chemical Corps, will be discontinued.
