I.. GENERAL COURTS MARTIAL.—By direction of the President, the commanding officer, Japan Logistical Command, is empowered, pursuant to AW 8, to appoint general courts martial, effective 30 August 1950.

~~**II.. GENERAL COURTS MARTIAL.**—By direction of the President, the commanding officer, Northern Command, at present located at APO 609, in care of Postmaster, San Francisco, California, is empowered, pursuant to AW 8, to appoint general courts martial, effective 4 September 1950.~~

III.. GENERAL COURTS MARTIAL.—By direction of the President, the commanding officer, United States Army Forces, Antilles, and Military District of Puerto Rico, is empowered, pursuant to AW 8, to appoint general courts martial, effective 28 August 1950.

IV.. ARMY REGIONAL ACCOUNTS OFFICE, FORT McPHERSON, GEORGIA.—1. Effective 1 July 1950, the Army Regional Accounts Office, AAU 9063, is established at Fort McPherson, Georgia, as a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Finance, Department of the Army.

2. Effective 1 August 1950, the Atlanta Finance Office, U. S. Army, Fort McPherson, Georgia, AAU 9010, is discontinued as a separate class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Finance, Department of the Army, but maintains its identity as an operating division of the Army Regional Accounts Office, Fort McPherson, Georgia.

3. Section IV, DA General Orders 20, 1950, is rescinded.

V.. BRANCH UNITED STATES DISCIPLINARY BARRACKS, MILWAUKEE, WISCONSIN.—Effective 1 October 1950, the Branch United States Disciplinary Barracks, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, a class I installation under control of the Commanding General, Fifth Army, is placed in an inactive status without change of jurisdiction.
