AWARD OF THE MEDAL OF HONOR









By direction of the President, under the act of Congress approved 9 July 1918 (WD Bul. 43, 1918), the Medal of Honor for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of life above and beyond the call of duty is awarded by the Department of the Army in the name of the Congress to the following-named officer:



Captain Lewis L. Millett, , Infantry (Artillery), Army of the United States, a member of Company E, 27th Infantry Regiment, distinguished himself by con-E, 27th Infantry Regiment, distinguished himself by conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity above and beyond the call of duty in action on 7 February 1951 in the vicinity of Soam-Ni, Korea. While personally leading his company in an attack against a strongly held position, he noted that the 1st Platoon was pinned down by smallarms, automatic, and antitank fire. Captain Millett ordered the 3d Platoon forward, placed himself at the head of the two platoons, and, with fixed bayonet, led the assault up the fire-swept hill. In the fierce charge, Captain Millett havened at we can prove solders and body contain Millett bayoneted two enemy soldiers and boldly continued on, throwing grenades, and clubbing and bayoneting the enemy, while urging his men forward by shouting encouragement. Despite vicious opposing fire, the whirlwind hand-to-hand assault carried to the crest of the hill. His dauntless leadership and personal courage so inspired his men that they stormed into the hostile position and used their bayonets with such lethal effect that the enemy fled in wild disorder. During this figree onslaught, Captain Millett was wounded by grenade fragments but re-fused evacuation until the objective was taken and firmly secured. The superb leadership, conspicuous courage, and consummate devotion to duty demonstrated by Captain Millett were directly responsible for the successful accomplishment of a hazardous mission and reflect the highest credit on himself and the heroic traditions of the military service. (This award supersedes the award of the Distinguished-Service Cross to Captain Millett, for heroism on the same date, published in General Orders 155, Headquarters, Eighth United States Army, Korea, 20 March 1951.)
