I..FORT RITCHIE, MARYLAND.—1. *Effective 1 November 1951*, the installation known as Camp Ritchie, Maryland, is established as a permanent Army installation and designated Fort Ritchie, Maryland.

2. *Effective 1 November 1951*, Fort Ritchie, Maryland, is established as a class I installation under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, Second Army, and placed in an active status.

II..ARMY AND NAVY HOSPITAL, HOT SPRINGS, ARKANSAS.—*Effective 1 November 1951*, the Army and Navy General Hospital, located at Hot Springs, Arkansas, is redesignated the Army and Navy Hospital, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of The Surgeon General.

III..SAN FRANCISCO QUARTERMASTER CENTER, ALAMEDA, CALIFORNIA.—1. *Effective 15 October 1951*, the San Francisco Quartermaster Market Center, Alameda, California, is established as a class II activity, under the jurisdiction of The Quartermaster General, at Alameda Medical Depot, California, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of The Surgeon General.

2. *Effective 30 November 1951*, the San Francisco Quartermaster Market Center, 180 New Montgomery Street, San Francisco, California, is discontinued.
