I. OFFICERS.—1. Pursuant to section 4, 1951 Amendments to the Universal Military Training and Service Act (Title I, PL 51, 82d Cong. DA Bul. 12, 1951), the tour of duty of officers, including warrant officers, of the Army (other than Regular Army officers) who are serving on extended active duty for periods of 21 months in the military service of the United States under orders issued pursuant to section 21, Universal Military Training and Service Act, as amended, is increased to 24 consecutive months, unless such persons are sooner released, transferred, or discharged, except that such officers of the Inactive and Volunteer Reserve (including those Inactive and Volunteer Reserve officers who were involuntarily assigned to Reserve units after 25 June 1950 and subsequently ordered into active military service with such units) who served on active duty for a period of 12 months or more in any branch of the Armed Forces between 7 December 1941 and 2 September 1945, both dates inclusive, shall, upon completion of 17 or more months of active military service performed since 25 June 1950, be released from active duty unless the Secretary of the Army shall find their rating or specialty is critical and that their release will impair the efficiency of the Army.

2. Nothing in the foregoing will be construed as altering any special programs for release of members of the Reserve components, nor will it affect existing directives which authorize the voluntary extension of terms of service.

II. BURLINGTON ORDNANCE PLANT, BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY.—Effective 1 November 1951, the Burlington Ordnance Plant, Burlington, New Jersey, is established as a class II industrial installation, under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance, and placed in an active status.
