I. ARMY LOGISTICS MANAGEMENT CENTER, FORT LEE, VIRGINIA.

1. *Effective 1 May 1956*, the Army Logistics Management Center is established at Fort Lee, Virginia, as a class II activity under the administrative jurisdiction of The Quartermaster General and the operational control of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics.

2. The Army Supply Management Course, established by section I, DA General Orders 38, 1954, will be a subordinate activity of the Army Logistics Management Center.

II. BAY AREA ARMY TERMINAL CENTER, FORT MASON, CALIFORNIA.

Effective 30 April 1956, the Bay Area Army Terminal Center is established as a class II activity under the Chief of Transportation at Fort Mason, California, and is assigned to the Pacific Transportation Terminal Command.

III. FIELD ARTILLERY ROTC UNIT, WEST VIRGINIA STATE COLLEGE, INSTITUTE, WEST VIRGINIA. *Effective the beginning of the 1956-57 academic year*, the Field Artillery ROTC unit at West Virginia State College, Institute, West Virginia, is converted to a General Military Science ROTC unit.
