I. ARMY ANTIAIRCRAFT COMMAND, ENT AIR FORCE BASE, COLORADO. *Effective 21 March 1957*, the Army Antiaircraft Command with headquarters at Ent Air Force Base, Colorado, is redesignated U. S. Army Air Defense Command. The five regional commands are designated as regional commands of the U. S. Army Air Defense Command.

III. ARMY AVIATION CENTER, FORT RUCKER, ALABAMA. *Effective 1 January 1957*, Army Aviation Center, Fort Rucker, Alabama, is redesignated United States Army Aviation Center.

IV. FORT STEWART AAA AND TANK TRAINING CENTER, FORT STEWART, GEORGIA. *Effective 1 January 1957*, Fort Stewart AAA and Tank Training Center, Fort Stewart, Georgia, is redesignated United States Army Antiaircraft Artillery and Tank Training Center.
