I. SPECIAL COURTS-MARTIAL. The Commanding Officer, 329th Engineer Detachment (Geodetic Survey), is designated by the Secretary of the Army, pursuant to the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 23 (a) (7), to convene special courts-martial effective 21 March 1957.
