REPUBLIC OF KOREA PRESIDENTIAL UNIT CITATION. The Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation which was awarded by the Republic of Korea to the following units of the United States Army is confirmed in accordance with AR 220-105:

REPUBLIC OF KOREA PRESIDENTIAL UNIT CITATION awarded by citation dated 16 November 1955, by Syngman Rhee, President of the Republic of Korea, for exceptionally meritorious service to the Republic of Korea during the period 11 September 1950 to 16 November 1955, inclusive, with citation as follows: The Tenth United States Antiaircraft Artillery Group has rendered valiant and meritorious service in the defense of freedom in Korea. Joining the United Nations Forces in September 1950, the Group contributed significantly to the success of United Nations operations against the Communist aggressors. Since the cessation of hostilities, the Group has given valued assistance in preparing Republic of Korea Forces to shoulder its important responsibilities for maintaining combat readiness against the ever present threat of renewed Communist aggression. Since May 1955 the Tenth United States Antiaircraft Artillery Group has given special attention to the activation and training of the First Republic of Korea Army Antiaircraft Artillery Brigade. Various obstacles were met with efficiency and difficulties resolved with professional competence, patience, and ingenuity. The outstanding services, heroism, and devotion to duty of the members of the Tenth United States Antiaircraft Artillery Group reflects great credit upon them and are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.
