I..UNITED STATES ARMY ORDNANCE MISSILE COMMAND, REDSTONE ARSENAL, ALABAMA. *Effective 31 March 1958*, the United States Army Ordnance Missile Command is established under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance. *Effective 31 March 1958*, the Headquarters, United States Army Ordnance Missile Command is established at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, as a class II Ordnance Corps activity.

II..FORT RODMAN, MASSACHUSETTS. *Effective 1 April 1958*, Fort Rodman, Massachusetts, a class I subinstallation of the Boston Army Base, Massachusetts, is redesignated a class I subinstallation of Fort Devens, Massachusetts, a class I installation under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, First United States Army.

III..U. S. ARMY CHAPLAIN LOGISTICS OFFICE, RICHMOND QUARTERMASTER DEPOT, RICHMOND, VIRGINIA. *Effective 23 June 1958*, the U. S. Army Chaplain Logistics Office is established as a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Chaplains, at the Richmond Quartermaster Depot, Richmond 12, Virginia, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of The Quartermaster General.

IV..U. S. ARMY SIGNAL ENGINEERING LABORATORIES, FORT MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY. *Effective 1 April 1958*, the U. S. Army Signal Engineering Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, are redesignated the U. S. Army Signal Research and Development Laboratory.
