**I..U. S. ARMY CIVIL AFFAIRS AND MILITARY GOVERNMENT SCHOOL, FORT GORDON, GEORGIA.** *Effective 1 July 1958*, the U. S. Army Civil Affairs and Military Government School (8581), a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Civil Affairs and Military Government, located at The Provost Marshal General Center, USA, Fort Gordon, Georgia, is discontinued. Concurrent with the discontinuance of the activity, the U. S. Army Civil Affairs and Military Government School (3447) is organized as a class I activity under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, Third United States Army, with no change in station.

**II..U. S. ARMY SIGNAL PACIFIC COAST AGENCY.** *Effective 16 June 1958*, the U. S. Army Signal Pacific Coast Agency is established as a class II activity, under the jurisdiction of the Chief Signal Officer, at Pasadena, California.
