I. GENERAL COURTS-MARTIAL. The Commanding Officer, United States Army Task Force 201 is designated by the Secretary of the Army, pursuant to the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 22 (a) (6), to convene general courts-martial, *effective 21 August 1958.*

II. UNITED STATES ARMY ORDNANCE SPECIAL WEAPONS—AMMUNITION COMMAND, PICATINNY ARSENAL, DOVER, NEW JERSEY. *Effective 1 September 1958,* the United States Army Ordnance Special Weapons—Ammunition Command, is established as a class II Ordnance Corps activity at Picatinny Arsenal, Dover, New Jersey, under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance.

III. U. S. ARMY GENERAL SUPPLIES COMMODITY CENTER. *Effective 31 August 1958,* the U. S. Army General Supplies Commodity Center is established as a class II activity, under the jurisdiction of The Quartermaster General, at Richmond Quartermaster Depot, Richmond, Virginia.

IV. U. S. ARMY MEDICAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT COMMAND. *Effective 20 August 1958,* the U. S. Army Medical Research and Development Command, is established as a class II activity, under the jurisdiction of The Surgeon General, at Washington, D. C.

V. U. S. ARMY MEDICAL NUTRITION LABORATORY. *Effective 1 September 1958,* the U. S. Army Medical Nutrition Laboratory, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of The Surgeon General, located at Fitzsimons Army Hospital, Colorado, is discontinued.

VI. COMMAND MANAGEMENT SCHOOL, FORT BELVOIR, VIRGINIA. *Effective 1 August 1958,* the Command Management School, a class I activity under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, Military District of Washington, U. S. Army, at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, a class II installation, is redesignated the U. S. Army Management School.

VII. JUSTIN F. KIMBALL SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL, DALLAS, TEXAS.
Effective 2 September 1958, Justin F. Kimball Senior High School, Dallas, Texas, in the Dallas Independent School District, is authorized to participate in the military training program under the provisions of title 10, United States Code, sections 3540b and 4651. This program will be known as the National Defense Cadet Corps Program.
