I. GENERAL COURTS-MARTIAL. The Commanding Officer, United States Army, Hawaii, is designated by the Secretary of the Army, pursuant to the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 22(a) (6), to convene general courts-martial effective 1 April 1960.

II. SOCIETY OF AMERICAN MILITARY ENGINEERS ROTC RIFLE COMPETITION. 1. In accordance with paragraph 11, AR 145-395, as amended, City College of New York, New York, New York, is announced as the winner of the 1960 Society of American Military Engineers ROTC trophy. The trophy having been won three times (1958, 1959, 1960), now becomes the permanent possession of the City College of New York.
