THE WHITE HOUSE SERVICE CERTIFICATE AND THE WHITE HOUSE SERVICE BADGE

1. Executive Order 10879, 1 June 1960, establishes the White House Service Certificate and the White House Service Badge.

2. The White House Service Certificate is to be awarded in the name of the President of the United States, as public evidence of deserved hour and distinction, to members of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, and Air Force, other than the Presidential Aides, who have been detailed to duty in the White House for at least one year subsequent to 20 January 1953. It is awarded to Army members by the Secretary of the Army upon recommendation of the Military Aide to the President.

3. No more than one White House Service Cortificate shall be awarded to any one person.

4. The White House Service Certificate may be granted posthumously.

5. The White House Service Badge will be issued to members of the Army detailed to duty in the White House as determined by the Military Aide to the President. The badge may be worn as a part of the uniform during the period of the wearer's detail to White House duty.

6. The badge when worn by men will be centered between the bottom of the flap and the bottom of the right breast pocket. When worn by women it will be centered on the right simulated upper pocket of the taupe coat and jacket, and opposite the third button of all other coats.
