I. DISTINGUISHED SERVICE MEDAL. 1. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 9 July 1918, the Distinguished Service Medal for exceptionally meritorious and distinguished service in a position of great responsibility is awarded to:

Major General *Anthony J. D. Biddle*, , United States Army. July 1945 to March 1961.

Major General *Richard G. Prather*, , United States Army. September 1950 to August 1961.

Lieutenant General *Gordon B. Rogers*, , United States Army. October 1953 to August 1961.

2. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 9 July 1918, the Distinguished Service Medal (First Oak Leaf Cluster) for exceptionally meritorious and distinguished service in a position of great responsibility is awarded to:

II. LEGION OF MERIT. 1. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 20 July 1942, and Executive Order 10600, 15 March 1955, the Legion of Merit for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service is awarded to:

III. DISTINGUISHED FLYING CROSS. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 2 July 1926, a Distinguished Flying Cross for extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial flight is awarded to:

Chief Warrant Officer *Michael V. Mayville*, , United States Army.
10 June to 14 July 1960. (This award supersedes so much of General Orders No. 42, Department of the Army, dated 7 November 1960, as pertains to the previous award of the Air Medal to Warrant Officer Mayville for meritorious achievement from 10 June to 14 July 1960.)

Chief Warrant Officer *Ulysses Morton*, , United States Army.
10 June to 14 July 1960. (This award supersedes so much of General Orders No. 42, Department of the Army, dated 7 November 1960, as pertains to the previous award of the Air Medal to Warrant Officer Morton for meritorious achievement from 10 June to 14 July 1960.)

IV. SOLDIER'S MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved 2 July 1926, a Soldier's Medal for heroism not involving actual conflict with an enemy is awarded to:

Captain *Robert D. Harbert*, , Adjutant General's Corps, United States Army, a member of Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Special Troops, United States Army Aviation Center, distinguished himself by heroism at Fort Rucker, Alabama, on 5 March 1961. Awakened at 0500 hours by screams for help Captain *Harbert* discovered quarters across the street were afire. He ran immediately to the scene and learned that a young girl and her father were inside the burning house. Entering the rear of the house by removing a screen and breaking a window Captain *Harbert*, despite thick acrid smoke and intense heat, located the sleeping girl and removed her from the building. Captain *Harbert* then attempted to re-enter through the rear window in search of the girl's father but was not successful. Together with a fellow officer Captain *Harbert* attempted entry through the front of the house but by that time the smoke was so dense and the flames so intense that further efforts were impossible. Captain *Harbert's* prompt action and presence of mind in an emergency are in keeping with the best traditions of the United States Army and reflect distinct credit on himself and the military service.
