I._U.S. ARMY BALLISTIC MISSILE AGENCY. Diffective 11 December 1961. the U.S. Army Ballistic Misslie Agency, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance, located at Rodstone Arsenal, Alabama, is discontinued.

Effective 1 July 1953, the United States Army Ordnance Training Command is designated a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance with Headquarters at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance.
