- I_UNITED STATES ARMY RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT OFFICE, PANAMA (9988). 1. Effective 1 April 1962, the United States Army Research and Development Office, Panama (9988) is organized as a class II activity under the command of the Chief of Research and Development, with station at Fort Sherman, Canal Zone.
- 2. Administrative and logistical support will be provided this office on a reimbursable basis by the Commanding General, USARCARIB.
 - 3. Table of distribution 91-9988 is assigned to this activity.
- 4. The mission of this activity is to coordinate and supervise Army RDTE activities, to be responsible for joint environmental test activities and to represent the Chief of Research and Development in matters related to RDTE in the Canal Zone and surrounding areas in dealings with CG, USARCARIB, technical services and USCONARC test teams and other Government and civilian agencies.
