I. MICHOUD ORDNANCE PLANT, LOUISIANA. *Effective 23 March 1962*, the Michoud Ordnance Plant, Louisiana, was discontinued as a Department of the Army installation.

II. U.S. ARMY COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS COMBAT DEVELOPMENTS AGENCY, FORT HUACHUCA, ARIZONA.

Effective 1 June 1962, the U.S. Army Communications Electronics Combat Developments Agency is established as an activity of the U.S. Army Electronic Proving Ground, Fort Huachuca, Arizona, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief Signal Officer.

III. U.S. ARMY SIGNAL BOARD, FORT MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY. *Effective 1 June 1962*, the U.S. Army Signal Board located at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, is discontinued.

ALAMEDA ADMINISTRATION CENTER, ALAMEDA, CALIFORNIA. *Effective 30 June 1962*, Alameda Administration Center, Alameda, California, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of The Quartermaster General, is inactivated and redesignated the Alameda Annex of Sharpe General Depot, U.S. Army, Lathrop, California.
