V\_SOLDIER'S MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved 2 July 1926, a Soldier's Medal for heroism not involving actual conflict with an enemy is awarded to:

Warrant Officer James R. Frederickson, United States Army, a member of the United States Army Signal Supply Control Agency, United States Army, Europe, distinguished himself by heroism at Poitiers, France, on 23 December 1961. While visiting fellow soldiers in an apartment in the city, a defective butane gas bottle burst into flames. All occupants fled from the narrow, congested room except one soldier, who was temporarily blinded by the intense heat and flames. Warrant Officer Frederickson voluntarily, and with complete disregard for his own personal safety, re-entered the room, bravely crossed over the burning tank to his comrade who was attempting to open a window and shutter to leap 35 feet to the ground, and carried him through the flames to safety. Warrant Officer Frederickson's prompt courageous action saved the life of a fellow soldier and reflects the utmost credit on himself and the military service. (This award supersedes the previous award of the Army Commendation Medal for heroism on 23 December 1961, as announced in General Orders Number 83, dated 10 May 1962, Headquarters, U.S. Army Communications Zone, Europe.)

Corporal Myron M. Matteson, Jr., Military Police Corps, United States Army, a member of the 105th Military Police Company, United States Army Infantry Center Troop Command, distinguished himself by heroism on 15 March 1962, at Fort Benning, Georgia, in voluntarily risking his life to insure the safety of others during a fire which destroyed a major portion of the Main Officers' Open Mess. Upon his arrival at the scene of the fire, Corporal Matteson found that there were occupants in the burning building. Despite the dense choking smoke and fumes, and with complete disregard for his own personal safety, he immediately entered the building, made his way upstairs to the hotel portion, awakened the sleeping guests, and assisted them to safety. He voluntarily re-entered the blazing structure several times, crawling on his hands and knees through the dense smoke and choking poisonous fumes, to search for occupants. Although he was nearly overcome by the smoke and fumes, he persisted in his efforts until each of the guest rooms was thoroughly checked and all individuals were safely evacuated. Corporal Matteson's presence of mind, determined efforts, and courageous action in this emergency prevented possible tragedy and loss of life, and reflect great credit on himself and the military service.
