I. UNITED STATES ARMY LANGUAGE SCHOOL, PRESIDIO OF MONTEREY, CALIFORNIA. *Effective 1 July 1963*, the United States Army Language School, Presidio of Monterey, California, is discontinued as a class I activity under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, Sixth United States Army, and its assigned functions, personnel, funds, and facilities transferred to the Defense Language Institute, a class II activity established by DA General Orders 63, 1962.

II. DEFENSE LANGUAGE INSTITUTE, WEST COAST BRANCH. *Effective 1 July 1963*, the Defense Language Institute, West Coast Branch (short title "DLIWC") is organized at the Presidio of Monterey, California as a class II activity, under the command of the Director, Defense Language Institute, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations.

III. DEFENSE LANGUAGE INSTITUTE, EAST COAST BRANCH. *Effective 1 July 1963*, the Defense Language Institute, East Coast Branch (short title "DLIEC") is organized at Washington, D.C., as a class II activity under the command of the Director, Defense Language Institute, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations.

IV. ARMY CHEMICAL CENTER, MARYLAND. *Effective 1 January 1963*, the Army Chemical Center, Maryland is redesignated Edgewood Arsenal, Maryland.

V. SOCIETY OF AMERICAN MILITARY ENGINEERS ROTC RIFLE COMPETITION FOR 1963. 1. In accordance with paragraph 9, AR 145-395, Rose Polytechnic Institute, Terre Haute, Indiana, is announced as the winner of the 1963 Society of American Military Engineers ROTC trophy. This trophy will be retained by Rose Polytechnic Institute until such time as notification of the winner of the 1964 competition is published.
