- 1._U.S. ARMY TRANSPORTATION AGENCY, WASHINGTON, D.C.
 1. Effective 16 September 1963, the U.S. Army Transportation Agency, Washington, D.C., is established in the Washington area as a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Transportation, and is attached to the Office of the Chief of Transportation for administrative support. Concurrently, functions, personnel, funds, records, and equipment presently assigned to and utilized by the Military District of Washington, U.S. Army, for Army motor vehicle transportation support services to the White House are transferred to the U.S. Army Transportation Agency, Washington, D.C.
 - 2. Table of Distribution Number TC-7410 is assigned to the Agency.
- 3. The mission of the Agency is to provide Army motor vehicle services to meet White House requirements.
