- I. UNITED STATES ARMY MILITARY MISSION WITH THE IMPERIAL IRANIAN GENDARMERIE (GENMISH). Effective 15 March 1964, the U.S. Army Military Mission with the Imperial Iranian Gendarmerie (GENMISH), Teheran, Iran, is transferred from the command of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations, Headquarters, Department of the Army, to the command jurisdiction of the Commander in Chief, U.S. Strike Command/U.S. Commander in Chief, Middle East/Southern Asia and Africa South of the Sahara (CINCSTRIKE/USCINCMEAFSA).
- II. MALTA TEST STATION, NEW YORK. Effective 4 February 1964, the Malta Test Station, New York, was discontinued as a Department of the Army installation.
- III_UNITED STATES ARMY ARCTIC TEST BOARD, FORT GREELY, ALASKA. Effective 1 March 1964, the U.S. Army Arctic Test Board, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, U.S. Army Materiel Command, with station at Fort Greely, Alaska, is redesignated the U.S. Army Arctic Test Center.
- IV. UNITED STATES ARMY RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT OFFICE, PANAMA. Effective 1 March 1964, the U.S. Army Research and Development Office, Panama, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, U.S. Army Materiel Command, with station at Fort Clayton, Canal Zone, is redesignated the U.S. Army Tropic Test Center.
- V. SOCIETY OF AMERICAN MILITARY ENGINEERS ROTC RIFLE COMPETITION. 1. In accordance with paragraph 9, AR 145-395, Northeastern University, Boston, Massachusetts, is announced as the winner of the 1964 Society of American Military Engineers ROTC trophy. This trophy will be retained by Northeastern University until such time as notification of the winner of the 1965 competition is published.
