- I._.U.S. ARMY INTELLIGENCE CORPS COMMAND. 1. Effective 1 January 1965, the U.S. Army Intelligence Corps Command is established with headquarters at Fort Holabird, Maryland, as a major field command of the Department of the Army, with an assigned priority of 2.12.
- 2. Paragraph 3, GO 32, 1956, subject: "Responsibility for Civilian Personnel Management in the Army Establishment," as amended, is further amended by adding subparagraph "n" as follows:
 - n. The Commanding General, U.S. Army Intelligence Corps Command, for activities under his command.
- II._U.S. ARMY INTELLIGENCE CORPS AGENCY. Effective 1 January 1965, the U.S. Army Intelligence Corps Agency, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Department of the Army, is discontinued and all of its assigned units, personnel, funds, records, and equipment concurrently transferred to the U.S. Army Intelligence Corps Command.
