Captain Thomas I. Ledbetter, , Infantry, United States Army, distinguished himself by gallantry in action while engaged in military operations in Vietnam on 19 June 1964. As a Senior Advisor, Captain Ledbetter was accompanying a Vietnamese combat patrol on a search and clear operation when the friendly element engaged a strong hostile force which was defending a heavily fortified position. Although he sustained wounds twice while directing the attack on the enemy, he bravely remained in the lead position to organize and direct the assault against the hostile force. Throughout three vicious enemy attacks, he displayed fortitude, fearlessness, and forceful leadership which rallied the troops and encouraged them to withstand the violence of the enemy charge. Despite the overwhelming onslaught, he continued to lead the troops and personally engaged the enemy with outstanding effectiveness until his ammunition was expended. Captain Ledbetter's courageous actions, determination, and conspicuous gallantry are in the highest traditions of the United States Army and reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

Through his prompt action, determination, and bravery, he prevented possible loss of life to personnel in the area and further damage to valuable government property. Sergeant Fox's heroic conduct is in the highest traditions of the United States Army and reflects great credit upon himself and the military service.
