IV_SOLDIER'S MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved 2 July 1926, a Soldier's Medal for heroism not involving actual conflict with an enemy is awarded to:

Captain James P. Fero, , Corps of Engineers, United States Army, distinguished himself by heroism on 10 November 1964 while serving as an Instructor with the School of Military Engineering, Liverpool, New South Wales, Australia. Captain Fero was directing the swamping of a prototype assault boat, as part of a test operation, on the Georges River when he saw an Australian soldier lose his hold on the boat, attempt to inflate a malfunctioning life jacket, and then sink beneath the surface of the deep river. Without a life preserver and fully clothed, Captain Fero immediately dove into the river in an effort to save the drowning man. Although the victim was held under the water by a heavy load of combat gear, Captain Fero succeeded in pulling him from the bottom of the river and supporting his head above water until another instructor swam to the area and assisted in towing the drowning man to the safety of the shore. Captain Fero's heroic conduct in this emergency situation and profound concern for his fellow man are in the highest traditions of the United States Army and reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

Specialist Five Vernon D. Hartman, , United States Army, as a member of Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1st Technical Battalion (Aircraft Maintenance Depot) (Seaborne), Naval Air Station, Corpus Christi, Texas, distinguished himself by heroism on 8 October 1965, in the vicinity of Yorktown, Texas. As Crew Chief, Specialist Hartman was one of four persons aboard a CH-21 Shawnee Helicopter when it crashed, ruptured its fuel tank, and burst into flames. Assured that both of the injured pilots were able to get out of the burning aircraft by themselves, Specialist Hartman ignored his own multiple wounds, the danger of a gasoline explosion, and the opportunity to escape by the forward exit in a brave effort to locate a fellow crewman. With complete disregard for his own safety, he crawled over torn metal and equipment, reached the aft end of the blazing cargo compartment, and discovered the soldier, unconscious and with his clothing burning from spattered gasoline. He then dragged the unconscious crewman from the burning helicopter and, while smothering the flames on the victim with his own body, received burns on his own hands and wrists. Through his indomitable courage and profound concern for others, he saved the life of his fellow soldier. Specialist Hartman's heroic conduct in this hazardous situation is in the highest traditions of the United States Army and reflects great credit upon himself and the military
