- I_UNITED STATES ARMY RECRUITING COMMAND. 1. Effective 1 July 1966, the United States Army Recruiting Command, a class I activity under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, United States Continental Army Command, with headquarters at Fox Hill, Hampton, Virginia, is redesignated a class II activity and placed under the jurisdiction of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel, Headquarters, Department of the Army.
- 2. Effective 1 July 1966, the following United States Army Recruiting Stations and Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Stations, together with their functions, personnel, records, and equipment, are transferred from commands indicated and established as subordinate activities of the United States Army Recruiting Command, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel:

- II_USE OF THE TERM "CONTINENTAL ARMY COMMANDER." General Orders 58, 1955, which established the term "ZI Army Commanders" is rescinded.
- III_LAUNDRY TECHNICAL OFFICE, U.S. ARMY. Effective 30 June 1966, the Laundry Technical Office, U.S. Army, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Support Services, located at 1819 West Pershing Road, Chicago, Illinois 60609, is discontinued. Its missions, functions, and records are transferred to the Chief of Support Services, Washington, D.C. 20315.
- IV__ENGLISH LANGUAGE SCHOOL, DEFENSE LANGUAGE INSTITUTE. 1. Effective 1 July 1966, the English Language School, Defense Language Institute is organized at Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas, as a subordinate activity of the Defense Language Institute, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Deputy Chief of Staff of Personnel.

- 2. The mission of the English Language School is, under applicable regulations pertaining to operation of the Military Assistance Program, to develop English language proficiency in foreign students to enable them to attend U.S. military department flying, technical, and professional courses and to provide designated foreign governments with trained English language instructors, technicians, and supervisors and to provide, including the development thereof where necessary, course materials, aptitude and proficiency tests, training aids, language laboratories and technical information and guidance required for establishing and conducting effective English language training programs in their respective countries.
- 3. On 1 July 1966, the United States Air Force Language School, Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas, will be discontinued, and appropriate English language training functions, elements, and resources of the Department of the Air Force will be transferred to the Defense Language Institute.
