I. UNITED STATES ARMY SUPPLY AND MAINTENANCE COMMAND. *Effective 1 July 1966*, the United States Army Supply and Maintenance Command, a major subordinate command of the United States Army Materiel Command, with Headquarters at Washington, D.C., is discontinued and all of its assigned functions, organizations, personnel, funds, records and facilities transferred to Headquarters, United States Army Materiel Command.

II. UNITED STATES ARMY TRANSPORTATION ENGINEERING AGENCY. *Effective 1 July 1966*, the United States Army Transportation Engineering Agency, located at Fort Eustis, Virginia, a class II activity of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics, Headquarters, Department of the Army, is transferred to the jurisdiction of the Commander, Military Traffic Management and Terminal Service.

III. LORDSTOWN MILITARY RESERVATION, OHIO. Section V, General Orders 26, 1966, which redesignated the Lordstown Military Reservation, is rescinded.

IV. U.S. ARMY PERSONNEL CENTER, FORT LEWIS, WASHINGTON. So much of section II, General Orders 23, 1966, as reads "Fort Louis" is amended to read "Fort Lewis."
