Major Vedder B. Driscoll, Artillery, United States Army, who while serving as a member of United States Army Field Detachment "R",

United States Forces, distinguished himself by heroism on 5 June 1965, in the vicinity of the Gschwand Bridge, Loisach River, Germany. While on a Rod and Gun picnic with other military personnel and their dependents, Major Driscoll heard the screams of alarm from children standing on a footbridge and then saw the 9-year old son of an American soldier being carried away by the turbulent waters of the flood-swollen Loisach River. With full knowledge of the swift current, the extreme depths, and the huge protruding boulders in the cold river, he completely ignored his own safety and jumped into the river in an attempt to recover the child. Although slammed into boulders and driftwood, he fought the treacherous undertow and came within 15 feet of the drowning boy as he, himself was swept onto a large rock in the middle of the stream. He then struggled from the rock to the river bank where he ran downstream approximately 250 yards in pursuit of the boy when he was prevented from going further by a barricade of fallen trees. Despite his extreme exhaustion, he returned to the picnic area and helped organize and conduct a futile search for the missing boy. Major Driscoll's heroic conduct, determination, and deep concern for the welfare of others are in the highest traditions of the United States Army and reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

VII\_BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of Executive Order 11046, 24 August 1962, a Bronze Star Medal with "V" device for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against hostile forces is awarded to:

Sergeant Timothy D. Hanna, , Infantry, United States Army, who while serving as a member of Company C, 2d Battalion, 23d Infantry, distinguished himself by heroic achievement on 18 November 1965, in Korea. Sergeant Hanna was leading a patrol in its return from the Demilitarized Zone in Korea when a noise was heard in the underbrush. After positioning his men, he tried to move forward but was stopped when wounded by hostile automatic weapons fire. Ignoring his multiple wounds, he continued to move forward, covered his men, and kept the patrol under control in a manner which prevented further casualties and unfavorable incidents. Sergeant Hanna's sound judgment, professional ability, and heroic conduct in this hazardous situation reflect distinct credit upon himself and the United States Army. (This award supersedes the Army Commendation Medal with "V" device awarded to Sergeant Timothy D. Hanna for heroism on 18 November 1965, as announced in General Orders Number 14, Headquarters 2d Infantry Division, APO San Francisco 96224, dated 18 January 1966.)

Bachali, (then First Lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army, who while serving as an Aviator, 173d Airborne Brigade (Separate), United States Army, Ryukyu Islands, distinguished himself by heroic achievement while participating in aerial flight on 28 August 1964, over the East China Sea. As a helicopter Pilot, Captain Bachali was approaching the runways of Hamby Airfield when he was informed of an overwater bailout. Although no water safety equipment was aboard his helicopter, he unhesitatingly proceeded to the bailout area to recover the pilot of the downed aircraft. Upon reaching the impact area and, after circling at an altitude of 25 feet, he observed a parachute protruding from the water. Assuming that the missing pilot was still fastened to the parachute skids, Captain Bachali hovered inches above the water while the copilot of his aircraft climbed out on the skids in an attempt to secure the parachute. Throughout the dangerous mission, he demonstrated outstanding flying skill, determination, and courage, continuing the hazardous maneuver until an Air Force rescue helicopter arrived on the scene to assist in the rescue operation. Captain Bachali's heroic conduct, deep concern for a fellow aviator, and unique flying ability in this dangerous rescue mission are in the highest traditions of the United States Army and reflect distinct credit upon himself and the military service.
