I. BLACK HILLS ARMY DEPOT. *Effective 25 April 1969*, Black Hills Army Depot, South Dakota, a class II inactive installation under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, U.S. Army Materiel Command, was discontinued as a Department of the Army installation.

II. SPRINGFIELD ARMORY, MASSACHUSETTS. *Effective 1 August 1969*, Springfield Armory, Mass., a class II inactive installation under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, U.S. Army Materiel Command, was discontinued as a Department of the Army Installation.

III. WARRIOR OF THE PACIFIC TEAM COMPETITION. In accordance with paragraph 5-66, AR 145-1, the annual Warrior of the Pacific rifle competition was conducted at General Military Science ROTC training camps. Eastern Washington State College, Cheney, Washington, 99004, is announced as the winner of the Warrior of the Pacific trophy for the year 1969. Average score per man was 63.37.

IV. SENIOR ROTC UNITS. 1. *Effective 30 June 1970*, the SENIOR ROTC units at Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts and Dartmouth College, Hanover, New Hampshire, will be terminated.

2. *Effective 24 February 1970*, the status of the ROTC unit at Tarleton State College, Stephenville, Texas, is changed from a satellite to an independent ROTC unit.

3. So much of section III, DA General Orders 81, 17 December 1968, as pertains to the establishment of a SENIOR ROTC unit at C. W. Post College of Long Island University, Greenvale, New York, is rescinded.

4. So much of section III, DA General Orders 81, 17 December 1968 as pertains to Virginia Commonwealth University, Richmond, Virginia and Boise State College, Boise, Idaho which reads: "academic year 1970-71" is amended to read: "academic year 1971-72".

V. JUNIOR ROTC UNITS. 1. *Effective 1 March 1970*, class HS JUNIOR ROTC units will be established at the following institutions under the provisions of AR 145-10 with training to commence September 1970:

Boaz High School, Boaz, Alabama

Warren High School, Warren, Arkansas

MacArthur Junior-Senior High School, Lawton, Oklahoma

2. *Effective 30 June 1970*, class HS JUNIOR ROTC units will be established at the following institutions under the provisions of AR 145-10 with training to commence September 1970:

Andrew Jackson High School, Kershaw, South Carolina

Buford High School, Lancaster, South Carolina (Conversion NDCC to JROTC)

Lancaster Senior High School, Lancaster, South Carolina

North Central High School, Indianapolis, Indiana

3. *Effective 31 December 1969*, the class MI JUNIOR ROTC unit at Palm Beach Military Academy, West Palm Beach, Florida, is reclassified to class HS. The high school unit will be disestablished *effective 30 June 1970*.

4. *Effective 1 June 1970*, class MI JUNIOR ROTC unit at St. Joseph's Military Academy, Hays, Kansas, will be disestablished.

5. *Effective 18 September 1969*, class HS JUNIOR ROTC unit at Kilmichael High School, Kilmichael, Mississippi, was disestablished.

6. So much of section IV, DA General Orders 49, 5 August 1969, as pertains to St. John's College High School which reads: "class HS JUNIOR ROTC" is amended to read: "NDCC".
