I. FORT MILES, DELAWARE. Effective 27 February 1970, Fort Miles, Delaware, a class I inactive installation under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, First United States Army was discontinued as a Department of the Army installation.

II. FORT HANCOCK, NEW JERSEY. Effective 1 March 1970, Fort Hancock, New Jersey, a class I installation under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, First United States Army is redesignated a class I subinstallation of Fort Hamilton, New York, a class I installation under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, First United States Army.

III. MILITARY OCEAN TERMINAL, BAYONNE, NEW JERSEY. Effective 6 March 1970, the Military Ocean Terminal, Bayonne, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Commander, Military Traffic Management and Terminal Service, is designated as a permanent Department of the Army installation.

IV. JUNIOR ROTC UNITS. 1. Effective 1 March 1970, a class HS Junior ROTC unit was established at Longview High School, Longview, Texas, under the provisions of AR 145-10 with training to commence September 1970.

2. Effective 1 April 1970, class HS Junior ROTC units will be established at the following institutions under the provisions of AR 145-10 with training to commence September 1970.
