The citation reads as follows:

Arriving in the Republic of Vietnam in February 1966, the II Field Force and its subordinate and attached units have spread death and destruction among enemy forces throughout Military Region 3, striking the enemy's strongholds and logistics installations, then providing effective support for pacification and development of the Military Region. During operation TOAN THANG 42, conducted in Cambodia from 29 April to 30 June 1970, II Field Force, in coordination with Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces, successfully struck the enemy, destroying staging areas and supply bases. Exhibiting enormous zeal and gallantry, the members of II Field Force inflicted heavy personnel casualties on the enemy as well as seizing thousands of weapons and tons of ammunition and vital supplies. II Field Force has made substantial contributions in assisting the Republic of Vietnam in its struggle to resist Communist aggressors.

The 173d United States Airborne Brigade is a combat-experienced unit, composed of courageous soldiers who always display an enthusiastic anti-Communist spirit. During its five years of fighting in the Republic of Vietnam, the 173d Airborne Brigade has conducted 15 large-scale operations on battlefields in Military Regions 2 and 3, including Operations IRON TRIANGLE (1965) in the Iron Triangle area of Binh Duong; HUMP (1965) in War Zone D; NEW LIFE (1965) in Khanh Province; SMASH I (1965) in Phuoc Tuy; MARAUDER (1966) in Hau Nghia; CRIMP (1966) in Binh Duong; SILVER CITY (1966) in War Zone D; Bien Hoa; and Long Khanh, NIAGARA/CEDAR FALLS (1967) in the Iron Triangle area; JUNCTION

CITY ALTERNATE and JUNCTION CITY II (1967) in War Zone C; GREELEY and MACARTHUR (1967) in Dakoto; BOLLING (1969) in Tuy Hoa; WALKER (1969) in An Khe; COCHISE (1969) in Bong Son; and WASHINGTON GREEN (1969) in Binh Dinh, inflicting heavy losses upon enemy, both in personnel and his war-making materiel. The citation reads as follows:

Operating in the Republic of Vietnam from 19 June 1968 to 31 July 1970, the 199th Infantry Brigade has proven to be a highly trained unit, composed of outstanding fighting men, and has continually conducted military operations against the enemy. Although operating on difficult terrain and under unfavorable weather conditions, the men of the 199th Infantry Brigade made immeasurable contributions, carrying out 1,170 ambush operations, 474 long-range reconnaissance missions and 578 company-sized operations. In particular, during Operations FAIRFAX, MANCHESTER, CAESAR I and II, FRIENDSHIP III, and during the third and fourth phases of Operation Toan Thang,

the men of the 199th Infantry Brigade clashed fiercely with regular units of the 5th and 7th Work Sites and the 33d North Vietnamese Regular Regiment in the areas of Long Khanh, Bien Hoa, Phuoc Tuy and the Capital Military District, inflicting heavy personnel casualties and materiel losses upon the Communists. The 199th Infantry Brigade has made substantial contributions to the struggle against Communist aggression in the Republic of Vietnam.

The citation reads as follows:

Throughout the period June 1966 to January 1971, II Field Force Artillery and its subordinate units have, in addition to their combat support roles, concentrated their capabilities on developing strong civil actions and pacification and rural development programs in Military Region 3. In so doing, II Field Force Artillery and its subordinate units have expended more than 50,000 man-hours constructing seven schools and two pilot villages, repairing roads and bridges, digging wells, and rendering medical care and treatment. In addition, training nurses and providing guidance on sanitation and preventive medicine as well as teaching English and Mathematics was a part of II Field Force Artillery's contribution to the health and welfare of the Vietnamese people. The endeavors of II Field Force Artillery and its subordinate units have contributed immeasurably to the efforts of the Government of the Republic of Vietnam in its fight against Communist aggressors.

The citation reads as follows:

Having arrived in Vietnam in 1966, Headquarters, II United States Field Force has always worked with great zeal. In addition to the overall management of every military operation of all United States forces in its area of tactical responsibility in Military Region 3, it has always given attention to the civil affairs field in order to properly support the political efforts and uphold the cause of the Government of the Republic of Vietnam. During the period from 30 June 1969 to 30 June 1970, the II United States Field Force devoted material and manpower to expediting projects to help the Vietnamese people by developing transportation, communications, economic life and education, and by constructing homes, schools, and hundreds of kilometers of roads. In addition, there were hospitals, dispensaries, medical stations, and orphanages built and medical treatment and medicine distributed to more than 100,000 patients throughout Military Region 3. The II Field Force also organized relief and assisted in resettlement of war refugees. The II Field Force rendered invaluable assistance to the Vietnamese Nationals exiting Cambodia, contributing thousands of man-hours and millions of piasters as well as foodstuffs to sustain the refugees. While conducting operations in the Republic of Vietnam since January 1966, the 25th Infantry Division achieved many brilliant feats in combat and destroyed numerous Communist strongholds in the Provinces of Hau Nghia, Gia Dinh, Tay Ninh, Long An, and Binh Duong. In keeping with the finest traditions of good will, devotion to duty and mutual support in the struggle against the enemy the 25th Infantry Division began the task of a civil affairs program and gained excellent results. The distinguished accomplishments of the Division included supply of building materials for 6500 houses and distribution of 600 tons of food, 50 tons of other materials, 40,000 toys, and hundreds of thousands of tools for use by refugees. Other projects undertaken by the Division included construction of 81 dispensaries, 550 kilometers of highway, and 50 bridges and repair of 140 schools and 100 churches and temples. In the area of medical assistance, countless individuals were examined, treated, and provided medicine, while medical training was conducted in over 250 villages and hamlets. Materials were also supplied to Vietnamese Regional and Popular Forces to maintain outposts and a system of self-defense. Along with the brilliant achievements mentioned above, the 25th Infantry Division greatly enhanced the Republic of Vietnam's ability to conduct operations against a Communist aggressor as well as construct programs to build up their native country.

During the events of Tet 1968, Advisory Detachment 96 achieved outstanding results in civil affairs activities, such as providing war victims in the garrison and the neighboring areas of Can Tho with housebuilding materials, necessities, money, clothing and medicine, organizing an extensive relief program, and requesting donations from various charitable institutions in the United States for distribution to the victims' families in Can Tho. In addition to its relief activities, United States Army Advisory Detachment 96 has worked enthusiastically day and night in the IV Corps Tactical Zone and has built bridges, roads, and schools and installed a water distribution system for the Trung Vuong School in Cai Rang, Can Tho. Also, the Detachment has provided money, medical equipment, medical treatment, and health and welfare training. In addition, the Detachment assisted in obtaining scholarships for students so they might further pursue their studies. The Detachment has made significant contributions to the rural development program and has strengthened the

bonds of friendship between the Vietnamese and American peoples.
