I_GENERAL COURTS-MARTIAL. Confirming verbal orders of the Secretary of the Army of 7 January 1975, the Commander, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) and Fort Campbell, Fort Campbell, Kentucky 42223, is designated by the Secretary of the Army, pursuant to the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 22(a)(6), to convene general courts-martial effective 7 January 1975.

II_FORT ORD, CALIFORNIA. Effective 1 July 1975, Fort Ord, California is transferred from the command jurisdiction of the Commanding General, US Army Training and Doctrine Command to the command jurisdiction of the Commanding General, US Army Forces Command.

III_NATIONAL DEFENSE CADET CORPS UNITS. The Department of the Army announces the disestablishment of the National Defense Cadet Corps Units at Cardozo High School and Dunbar High School, Washington, DC, as requested by school officials. The effective date was 1 September 1974.

IV_US ARMY AERONAUTICAL DEPOT MAINTENANCE CENTER, TEXAS. Effective 1 July 1974, US Army Aeronautical Depot Maintenance Center (ARADMAC), Corpus Christi, Texas, an activity under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, US Materiel Command, is relieved from further assignment to the US Army Aviation Systems Command (AVSCOM) and redesignated as US Army Depot, Corpus Christi (CCAD).
