I. MILITARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT COMMAND (MTMC). Section II, DA GO 17, 1976, is superseded as follows:

1. Effective 1 July 1976, Military Traffic Management Command (MTMC) is assigned mission responsibility for operation of military water terminals in Northern and Central Europe and those terminals which are currently operational in the Federal Republic of Germany, The Netherlands, Belgium, Great Britain, Portugal, and Water and Terminal Clearance Authority (WTCA) functions associated with operation of these terminals. On the same date, US Army, Europe and Seventh Army is relieved of mission responsibilities for operation of these terminals and also Water and Terminal Clearance Authority (WTCA) functions associated with operation of these terminals.

2. Effective 1 October 1976, Military Traffic Management Command is assigned mission responsibility for operation of the common user ocean terminal and the Water Terminal Clearance Authority (WTCA) at Leghorn, Italy. On the same date, US Army, Europe and Seventh Army is relieved of mission responsibility for terminal operations and the Water and Terminal Clearance Authority (WTCA) functions.

3. Personnel spaces, funds, programs, and budgets related to the assignment to MTMC of mission responsibility for operation of military ocean terminals in Northern, Central, and Southern Europe, and WTCA functions, will be transferred to MTMC effective 1 October 1976.

II. RIVERBANK ARMY AMMUNITION PLANT, CALIFORNIA. Effective 1 March 1977, Riverbank Army Ammunition Plant, an inactive industrial installation under the command jurisdiction of the Commander, US Army Materiel Development and Readiness Command, is placed in an active status.

III. STRATFORD ARMY ENGINE PLANT, CONNECTICUT. Effective 30 June 1976, Stratford Army Engine Plant, former AF Plant #8, was established as an active Army industrial installation under the command jurisdiction of the Commander, US Army Materiel Development and Readiness Command.

IV. JUNIOR ROTC UNITS. 1. So much of DA General Orders Number 2, Section I, 28 January 1977, as reads "Cardozo High School, WASH, DC, To Commence Instruction NLT January 1977" is further amended to read "To Commence Instruction NLT September 1977."

2. In addition, so much of DA General Orders Number 2, Section III, 28 January 1977, as reads "Effective 15 January 1977, a Junior ROTC unit will be established at Coolidge High School, WASH, DC" is amended to read "Effective September 1977, a Junior ROTC unit will be established at Coolidge High School, WASH, DC"
