1. This confirms that on 24 August 1992, the United States Army Space Command (USARSPACE) was discontinued as a field operating agency of the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans, Headquarters, Department of the Army, and was established as a subordinate command of the United States Army Space and Strategic Defense Command (USASSDC). As such, it continues its designation as the Army component command of United States Space Command (USSPACECOM).


2. Mission. USARSPACE will control the Defense Satellite Communications Systems Operations Centers and manage joint tactical use of these resources; control Army BMD/ASAT and other forces and operational facilities, as assigned, and execute the operational portion of the Army Space Exploitation Demonstration Program. The U.S. Army Space Command (USARSPACE) will serve as the Army component to USSPACECOM and respond to USCINCSpace operational taskings; coordinate and integrate Army resources in the execution of USSPACECOM plans and operations and, enhance accomplishment of AirLand operations.
