**ESTABLISHMENT OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY CONTRACTING COMMAND
AS A MAJOR SUBORDINATE COMMAND OF THE
UNITED STATES ARMY MATERIEL COMMAND**

1. Effective 30 January 2008, by order of the Secretary of the Army, the United States Army Contracting Command (ACC) was established as a Major Subordinate Command of Army Materiel Command (AMC). The mission of the ACC is to provide global contracting support to warfighters through the full spectrum of military operations. This General Order further documents the establishment of the ACC, and it rescinds Headquarters, Department of the Army General Order Number 6, Establishment of the United States Army Contracting Agency (ACA), dated 26 September 2003.

2. The former United States Army Contracting Agency (ACA), headquartered at 5109 Leesburg Pike, Skyline 6, Suite 302, Falls Church, VA with the nine elements listed below, and all components thereof, are realigned under the ACC:

3. With the establishment of the ACC on 1 October 2008, the subordinate elements now include the following:

a. The former ACA elements referenced in paragraph 2 that are located outside the continental United States (OCONUS), and the United States Army Contracting Agency-The Americas, are realigned under the United States Army Expeditionary Contracting Command (ECC). Additionally, AMC's Contracting Support Brigades (CSB) are aligned under the ECC. The ECC provides contracting support to the United States Army Europe; United States Army Central; Eighth Army; United States Army North; United States Army South; United States Army Reserve Command; United States Army Pacific; and to OCONUS United States Army Installation Management Command (IMCOM) activities.

b. The former ACA elements referenced in paragraph 2 that are located within the continental United States (CONUS) are realigned under the United States Army Mission and Installation Contracting Command (MICC), with the exception of the United States Army Contracting Center of Excellence (CCE) and United States Army Information Technology, E-Commerce and Commercial Contracting Center (ITEC4) which are realigned under the ACC. The MICC provides primary contracting support to CONUS-based IMCOM activities; United States Army Training and Doctrine Command; United States Army Forces Command; United States Army Test and Evaluation Command; Military District of Washington; United States Army Reserve Command; and United States Military Academy. Additionally, the MICC will provide installation contracting support for the United States Army Medical Command installations.

c. The AMC Acquisition Centers are realigned under ACC. The ACC Acquisition Centers provide contracting support to the United States Army Aviation and Missile Command; United States Army Sustainment Command; United States Army Communications-Electronics Command; United States Army Joint Munitions Command; United States Army Research, Development and Engineering Command; Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command; United States Army Tank-Automotive and Armaments Command, United States Army Security Assistance Command; Chemical Materials Agency; Office of Program Manager, Saudi Arabian National Guard; Program Executive Officers and Direct Reporting Program Managers; and the Logistics Civil Augmentation Program Office. In addition, the ACC will provide Army enterprise-wide buying capability for common use information technology and systems for the Program Executive Office Enterprise Information Systems, U.S. Army Chief Information Officer (CIO)/G-6, and Network Enterprise Technology Command (NETCOM).

d. The Department of the Army's Senior Procurement Executive will continue to approve Head of Contracting Activity designations for the ACC and its subordinate organizations.

4. Effective 1 October 2008, Department of the Army proponentcy for the functions previously performed by the Army Contracting Agency under paragraph 10 of the rescinded Headquarters, Department of the Army General Order Number 6, Establishment of the United States Army Contracting Agency (ACA), dated 26 September 2003, is transferred to the Assistant Secretary of

the Army (Acquisition, Logistics and Technology). These functions include, but are not limited to, the Procurement Management Review program; Army Enterprise Business Systems, to include but not limited to, the Standard Procurement System (Procurement Desktop Defense), Army Federal Procurement Data System reporting, and the Army Contracting Business Intelligence System; and acquisition of services policy and oversight.
