**I—DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS.** By direction of the President, under the provisions of an Act of Congress approved 25 July 1963, the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism in action is awarded to:

Chief Warrant Officer Five David F. Cooper, Jr., B Company, 1st Battalion, 160th Aviation Regiment, on 27 November 2006, while serving as an AH–6 Flight Lead Pilot operating against an enemy force in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Without regard for his own personal safety, CW5 Cooper continued to provide effective fires for the ground force despite the presence of intense enemy fire. CW5 Cooper's actions destroyed several enemy positions and enabled the ground forces to hold defensive terrain. Without CW5 Cooper's courage and gallantry under fire, the ground forces would have sustained significant casualties. CW5 Cooper directly contributed to the successful execution of this classified direct action mission. CW5 Cooper's heroism reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army. This order supersedes the United States Army Human Resources Command, Permanent Orders 117–01.

Specialist Christopher H. Corriveau, C Company, 2d Battalion, 505th Parachute Infantry Regiment, on 26 August 2007, distinguished himself as part of a four-man sniper team in combat operations during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Specialist Corriveau's exceptional courage and tactical prowess under intense enemy fire and close combat contributed to the defeat of a concerted enemy effort to overrun his sniper position. Surrounded and attacked by an enemy force ten times superior to that of his own, Specialist Corriveau and his fellow paratroopers valiantly repelled the enemy attack with withering small arms fire and grenades. His four-man sniper team courageously fought off an overwhelming enemy force for control of the rooftop for over ten minutes in close combat, killing or wounding at least ten enemies in the process. Specialist Corriveau's bravery is in keeping with the finest traditions of military service and reflects great credit upon himself, the 82d Airborne Division, and the United States Army. This order supersedes the United States Army Human Resources Command, Permanent Orders 136–56.

**Specialist Eric A. Moser,** C Company, 2d Battalion, 505th Parachute Infantry Regiment, on 26 August 2007, distinguished himself as a Designated Marksman in combat operations during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Specialist Moser's exceptional courage and tactical prowess under intense enemy fire and close combat contributed to the defeat of a concerted enemy effort to overrun his sniper position. Surrounded and attacked by an enemy force ten times superior to that of his own, Specialist Moser and his fellow paratroopers valiantly repelled the enemy attack with withering small arms fire and grenades. His four-man sniper team courageously fought off

an overwhelming enemy force for control of the rooftop for over ten minutes in close combat, killing or wounding at least ten enemies in the process. Specialist Moser's bravery is in keeping with the finest traditions of military service and reflects great credit upon himself, the 82d Airborne Division, and the United States Army. This order supersedes the United States Army Human Resources Command, Permanent Orders 136–57.

Sergeant First Class Brendan W. O'Connor, Special Forces Operational Detachment Alpha 765, on 24 June 2006, distinguished himself as a Senior Medical Sergeant in Panjawai District, Kandahar Province, Afghanistan, during Operation Enduring Freedom. While conducting Operation Kaika, Sergeant First Class O'Connor led a quick reaction force to reinforce a surrounded patrol and rescued two wounded comrades. He maneuvered his force through Taliban positions and crawled alone and unprotected under enemy machine gun fire to reach the wounded Soldiers. He provided medical care while exposed to heavy volumes of fire and then carried one of the wounded Soldiers 150 meters across open ground to an area of temporary cover. Sergeant First Class O'Connor then climbed over a wall three times, in plain view of the enemy, to help the Soldiers seek cover while bullets pounded the structure around them. Sergeant First Class O'Connor assumed duties as the Detachment Operations Sergeant and led the consolidation of three friendly elements, each surrounded, isolated, and receiving fire from all directions. Sergeant First Class O'Connor's distinctive accomplishments and dedication to his comrades are in keeping with the finest traditions of military service and reflect great credit upon himself, the Special Operations Command Central, and the United States Army. This order supersedes the United States Army Human Resources Command, Permanent Orders 338-23.

**Sergeant Charles E. Wyckoff,** 3d Platoon, C Company, 1st Battalion, 508th Parachute Infantry, on 6 June 2007, distinguished himself as a Rifle Team Leader in combat operations during Operation Enduring Freedom. While engaged in close combat against determined enemy forces, Sergeant Wyckoff left his covered position without hesitation, to force the other members of his team to take cover. Sergeant Wyckoff revealed his position and fatally engaged two insurgents to save the lives of his Platoon. Sergeant Wyckoff's bravery is in keeping with the finest traditions of military service and reflects great credit upon himself, the 82d Airborne Division, and the United States Army. This order supersedes the United States Army Human Resources Command, Permanent Orders 136–58.
