REDESIGNATION AND ASSIGNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY RESERVE COMMAND AS A SUBORDINATE COMMAND OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY FORCES COMMAND

- 1. Effective immediately, the United States Army Reserve Command (USARC) (UIC: W47AAA) is discontinued as a Direct Reporting Unit to the Chief of Staff, Army and is redesignated and assigned as a subordinate command of the United States Army Forces Command (FORSCOM) (UIC: W3BYAA).
- 2. The Chief, Army Reserve, serves as both a member of the Army Staff in accordance with Section 3038, Title 10, United Stated Code and as the Commander, USARC. The Commander, USARC, commands all assigned Army Reserve Forces in accordance with Section 10171, Title 10, United States Code. USARC provides trained and ready units and qualified Soldiers who are prepared to mobilize and support the Armed Forces during times of war or national emergency and at such other times as the national security may require.
- **3.** Headquarters, Department of the Army General Orders Number 15, dated 16 October 2006, is hereby superseded.
