Kaho'ohanohano $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1}{2}$ On 2 May 2011, the President of the United States of America, authorized by an Act of Congress, March 3, 1863, has awarded, in the name of Congress, the Medal of Honor to $\stackrel{\wedge}{\sim}$ $\stackrel{\wedge}{\bowtie}$ Private First Class Anthony T. Kaho'ohanohano ☆ **United States Army** 公公公 For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty: Private First Class Anthony T. Kaho'ohanohano, Company H, 17th Infantry Regiment, 7th $\stackrel{\wedge}{\sim}$ Infantry Division, distinguished himself by extraordinary heroism in action against the enemy in the vicinity of Chupa-ri, Korea, on 1 September 1951. On that date, Private First Class $\frac{1}{2}$ Kaho'ohanohano was in charge of a machine-gun squad supporting the defensive positioning of Company F when a numerically superior enemy force launched a fierce attack. Because of the $\frac{1}{2}$ enemy's overwhelming numbers, friendly troops were forced to execute a limited withdrawal. As the men fell back, Private First Class Kaho'ohanohano ordered his squad to take up more $\frac{1}{2}$ defensible positions and provide covering fire for the withdrawing friendly force. Although having been wounded in the shoulder during the initial enemy assault, Private First Class Kaho'ohanohano gathered a supply of grenades and ammunition and returned to his original position to face the enemy alone. As the hostile troops concentrated their strength against his $\frac{1}{2}$ emplacement in an effort to overrun it, Private First Class Kaho'ohanohano fought fiercely and $\stackrel{\wedge}{\bowtie}$ courageously, delivering deadly accurate fire into the ranks of the onrushing enemy. When his ammunition was depleted, he engaged the enemy in hand-to-hand combat until he was killed. $\frac{1}{2}$ Private First Class Kaho'ohanohano's heroic stand so inspired his comrades that they launched a counterattack that completely repulsed the enemy. Upon reaching Private First Class Kaho'ohanohano's emplacement, friendly troops discovered 11 enemy soldiers lying dead in front of the emplacement and two inside it, killed in hand-to-hand combat.
