## DESIGNATION OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY SPACE AND MISSILE DEFENSE COMMAND/ARMY STRATEGIC COMMANDAS AN ARMY SERVICE COMPONENT COMMAND

- 1. Effective 16 October 2006, the United States Army Space and Missile Defense Command / Army Strategic Command (SMDC/ARSTRAT) (UIC: W6HUAA) is designated as an Army Service Component Command (ASCC) of the U.S. Strategic Command (USSTRATCOM), reporting directly to Headquarters, Department of the Army (HQDA).
- 2. SMDC/ARSTRAT conducts space and missile defense operations; provides planning, integration, control and coordination of Army forces and capabilities in support of USSTRATCOM missions; serves as the proponent for space and ground-based midcourse defense; is the Army integrator for global missile defense; provides mission-related research, development, and acquisition support; and serves as the focal point for desired characteristics and capabilities in support of USSTRATCOM missions.
- **3.** SMDC/ARSTRAT organizes, trains, mans, equips, and deploys Army Space and Ground-based Midcourse Defense forces to conduct worldwide space and ground-based midcourse defense operations in support of USSTRATCOM, Combatant Commands, and other agencies as directed. SMDC/ARSTRAT is an operational level Army Force designated by the Secretary of the Army as the ASCC of USSTRATCOM. SMDC/ARSTRAT exercises administrative control authority and responsibility on behalf of the Secretary of the Army and exercises operational control over Army Forces, as delegated by the Commander, USSTRATCOM.
- **4.** Effective 16 October 2006, the provisions of HQDA General Orders No. 5, dated 01 March 1998, inconsistent with this order are hereby superseded.
