Sergeant Shemin, upon three different occasions, left cover and $\frac{1}{2}$ crossed an open space of 150 yards, repeatedly exposing himself to heavy machine-gun and rifle fire, to rescue wounded. After officers and senior noncommissioned officers had become $\frac{1}{2}$ casualties, Sergeant Shemin took command of the platoon and displayed great initiative under fire until wounded on August 9.
